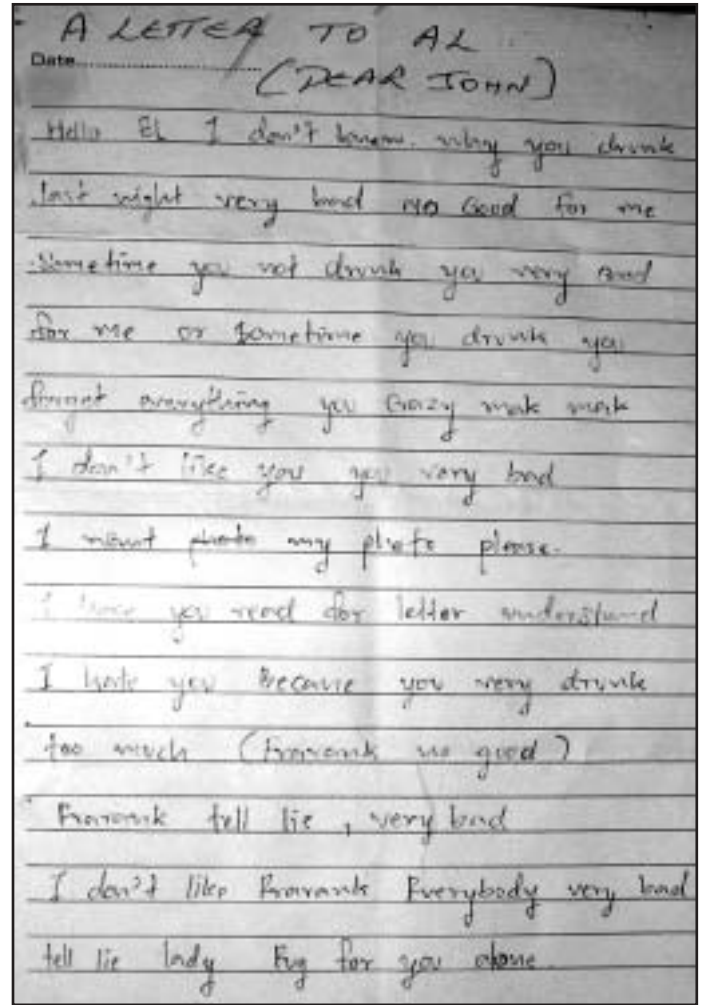
A LETTER TO AL
