Good Food And Cheap Too



One of the strange things we have noticed over the recent slow period or low season is the fact that some businesses have had the tendency to raise prices to compensate for the reduced number of people here.

This of course drives the remaining customers away thereby reducing profits even further.

For people who live here this probably does not come as a surprise and for tourists who visit here, well you probably don't realise because you are not here long enough to see the difference. But there are some businesses that look on the low season as a bit of a challenge, realise that there are limited customers and endeavour to entice the ones here through their doors.

One of those places is Legends Restaurant and Guesthouse. Although the premises have only been operating since last November, the managers have

been around for the past decade and have a fairly good idea on what will work and what won't.

One of the things they came up with was the 100 Baht BBQ on Saturday nights. An All-You-Can-Eat affair that proved to be so successful that they decided to run it on Wednesday nights also.

The food is simple Western fare with a touch of German (reflecting the area's predominant clientele). There is an abundance of salad and the stew has to be tasted to be appreciated. With Heineken and Carlsberg still priced at a reasonable 70 Baht (small bottle, 50 Baht draught) and a pool table to work off the calories, it is a filling night out that won't break the wallet.
